Poppy



As Poppy Chairman for 2019, again, we want to get an early start so that we can hopefully have greater success for our Veterans with our 2019 Poppy Campaign. **Our 2019 Poppy Campaign will run from Friday, October 25th to Monday, November 11th.**

Our 2018, Poppy Campaign successfully raised over \$25,700, a 9% increase over 2017. Our current Trust Fund balance as at June 30, 2019 is \$19,497.57. To June 30, 2019 we have donated \$16,200.00 in support of Veterans and their families.

A campaign this large could not come off without Legion Member volunteers who donated over 100 hours of in-store canvassing. Air Cadet volunteers provided close to 90 hours of canvassing support organized by their leader Capt. Rob Herborth. Close to 30 Branch Member volunteers helped prepare the Poppy boxes, with canvassing and audit, in the office and counting the money. Again, Many Thanks to all our volunteers for their devotion.

Why are personal canvassers so important? First, donations doubled to quadrupled when a live canvass volunteer was present vs. an unattended Poppy Box. In cases, where corporate policy will not allow us to put a Poppy Box(es) in a store, it increases our collections from that location from 0% to 100% when a canvasser is present.

When you joined the Legion, one of the key commitments you made, as a member, was to actively support our Poppy Campaigns. The success of any Poppy Campaign relies heavily on you, our Volunteers, especially canvassers. Please send me an email expressing your interest in Volunteering and your contact details. I look forward to hearing from you. I will ensure that you will be personally contacted and offered a role. Your time will be greatly appreciated to make our 2019 Campaign an even greater success!

HISTORY OF THE VICTORIA CROSS



On June 26, 1857, Her Majesty Queen Victoria, for the first time, pinned the Victoria Cross on the tunic of 62 of the original recipients or a family member for those deceased.

The new medal would be for gallantry in the field or at sea. It is awarded for exceptional individual acts of bravery.

The motivation for the medal had come a few years earlier from Albert, the Prince Consort. In 1855, following “The Charge of the Light Brigade”, in the Crimean War, Albert stated; “The brilliance of the charge and the gallantry and discipline, evidenced by all, have never been surpassed by British Soldiers under similar circumstances”.

The Cross design is 1 ½ inches square, attached to a ribbon by a wide “V” and to a bar on which there is a sprig of laurel, the token of Victory. Obverse a Royal Crown is surmounted by a lion, with a scroll that reads “For Valour”. The ribbon was Red for the Army and Blue for the Navy.

The cross itself, of course, is the symbol of SELF SACRIFICE.

The original Victoria Cross medals were made from the cannons captured from the Russians in the last battle of the Crimean War at Sebastopol. The metal in the cannons was melted down and sand caste for the Victoria Crosses.

It is the most coveted and highly prized decoration of military service for Britain and the Commonwealth Countries.

Deeds are only considered for Victoria Cross recognition when they far exceed a level of bravery one would expect from a fellow human being by putting their own welfare at severe risk.

In total, there have been 1,358 Victoria Cross Medals presented.



THE VICTORIA CROSS AND CANADIANS

What constitutes a Canadian VC recipient?

- 1) Was the individual a member of the Canadian Forces at the time of the deed?
- 2) Was the person born in Canada or its territories?
- 3) Did the person have a permanent residence in Canada at the outbreak of the war in which the deed occurred?
- 4) If not born in Canada, did the person establish a permanent residence in Canada or its territories?
- 5) Did the person consider himself to be a Canadian?

By using these criterion; there are 95 Canadian Recipients.

52 of the recipients were born in Canada.

34 were born in the United Kingdom.

4 were born in the U.S.

2 were born in Newfoundland prior to it joining Canada.

1 each was born in Denmark, India and Russia.

WWI had 71 recipients, WWII had 16 and the rest were split between the Crimean War, The uprisings in India and in the Boer Wars.

Since 1993 the Victoria Cross Medal is only a Great Britain Award.

Canada can now award its own Victoria Cross medal, but none have been awarded in that time.

There are no Canadian Victoria Cross recipients alive today. The last one died in 2005.

Cde Mike Atkinson poses with students from Northport Elementary School. Mr. Lawrence and the students collected 2 bottle jugs of Pop Tabs for wheelchairs. Cde Mike calculated the jugs weighed approximately 45 lbs and 1400 tabs = 1 lb; that would amount to 63,000 tabs the students collected.

Pop tabs come in from all over and a certificate and thank you to the school in Port Elgin that collected them will be sent out soon. Tabs that are collected are trucked to the local metal recycling plant where we are paid for them by the pound. The funds collected go into the Branch 229 Elora Legion Tabs for Wheelchair fund. From there, wheelchairs are purchased and given or loaned out to anyone in need. Sometimes, funds are provided to refurbish wheelchairs and periodically funds are provided to assist someone who needs a specific type of wheelchair and there is not sufficient money available through all channels of our health system to cover the cost. This takes the worry away from the recipient when there is a shortfall. Historically, many of these requests have been for children with special needs.

Padre's Corner D Day + 1



On June 7, 1944, (D-Day + 1) Branch member, **Clint Morden**, was wounded and captured by the German forces. Clint was with the Essex Scottish Regiment. He was first moved to a field dressing station, then sent to a hospital in Paris for a few weeks, and then to a prisoner of war camp in Eastern Europe.

On Friday, June 7, 2019, exactly 75 years after his capture, Kathryn Eastwood (Zone Commander) and Chuck Beaton (Chaplain) visited Clint in Trillium Place, a long term care facility in Kincardine. He was presented with carnations similar to the ones given to the veterans at Juno Beach, a gift from Branch 340.

At 95, Clint is not able to easily carry on a conversation, however, he told us he remembered the day he was shot. We told him that we were glad he survived, when 376 Canadians died, and hundreds were seriously wounded on the beach. We wanted him to know that we remembered him, and all the others who made the supreme sacrifice for us on that special day. It is our sacred duty to do so.

Lest we forget.

It was great day for our athletes to be competing at the District C Track &Field Meet on Saturday June 22, 2019.

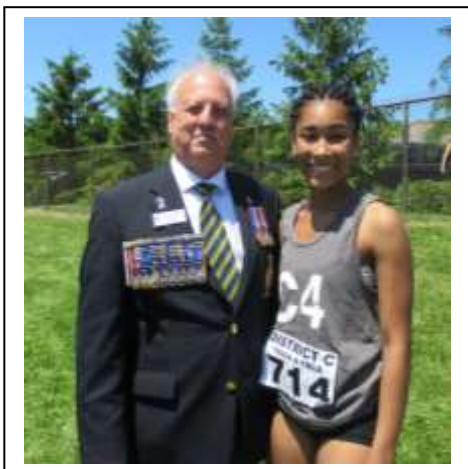
All the athletes competed very well and there were numerous personal bests achieved. 226 athletes were registered and 44 will be going on to Provincials.

More volunteers are needed to help make the work even lighter so please consider donating a few hours of your time next year.



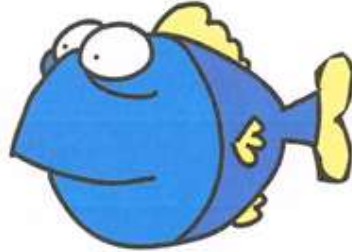
District C Commander Eric Ross opens the event as per Legion protocol and offers words of welcome to the athletes, families and volunteers.
